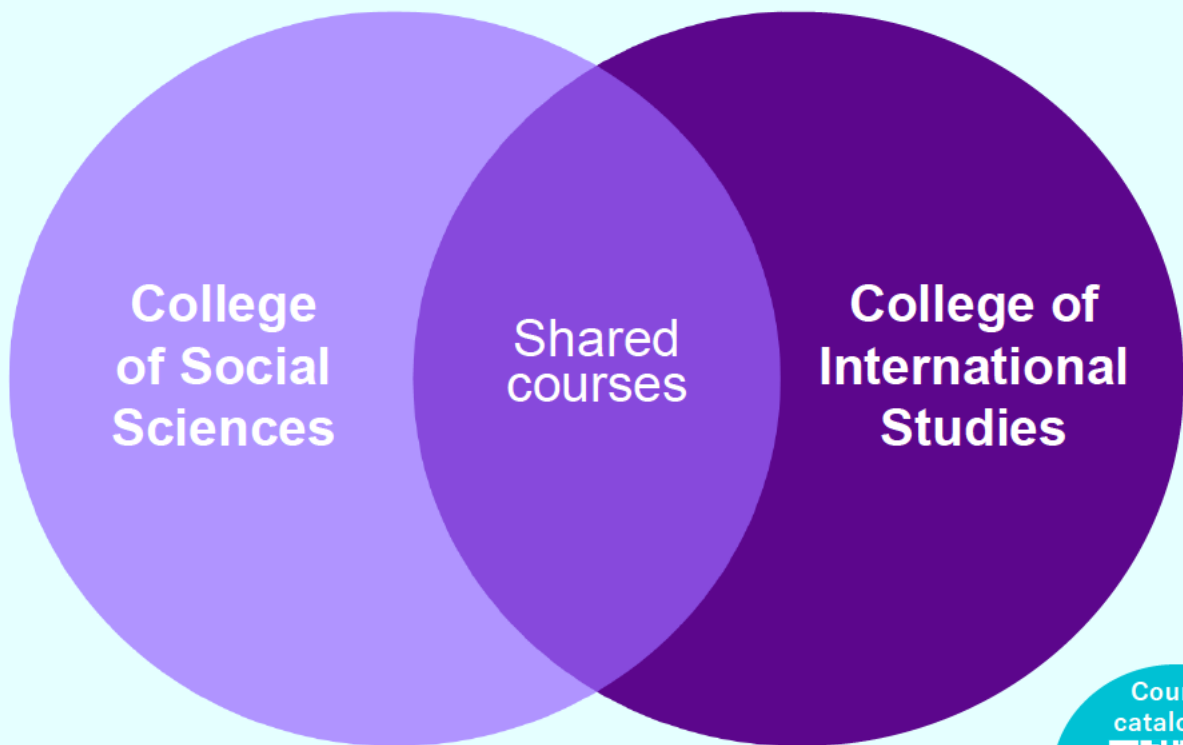


TISS

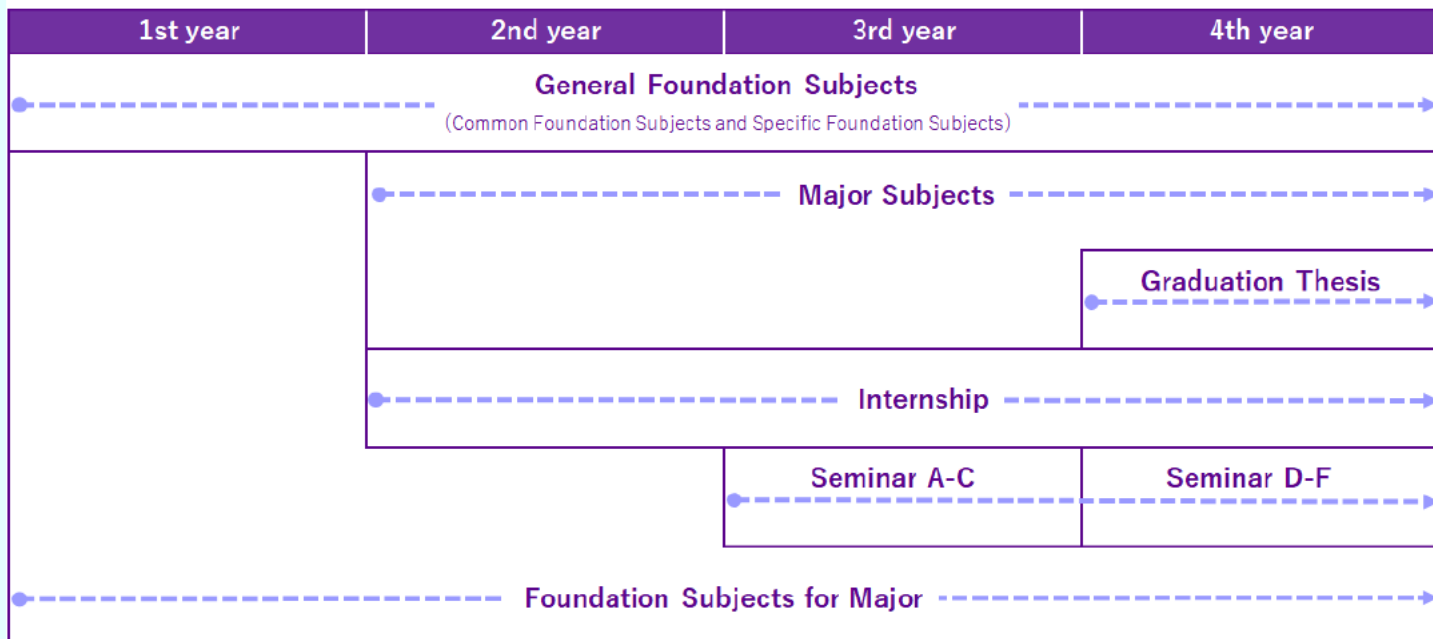
Courses - examples
